Schemes can be of any sort (community project / charity / publicly or privately funded / urban / rural) and may be seeking to mitigate (reduce carbon emissions, slow down species loss, cut use of plastics, etc.) or adapt (build resilient communities, increase amount of food grown and sold locally, etc.) or both.

If you are part of such a scheme and would be happy to share information about it (and are prepared to answer questions about it that might come in from readers), please send us a page of information (max. 500 words) and a couple of photographs (if possible and with permission if they feature recognisable humans!). This should include enough detail to inspire others and to enable them to get started themselves. Please include contact details and website/facebook etc. links if relevant. [If you need more room to describe your project, don't worry. Please send us a longer article/description and a separate 500-word abstract.]

We will then put your 'case study' on the Dorset CAN newsletter website (and the main Dorset CAN website once it's up and running) and include brief details in a future issue of the newsletter.

If you know of a scheme that you think could be suitable, please ask them to consider sending us details. If you come across a scheme somewhere else altogether (outside the county or country) that you think might work here, please send us a link and we'll investigate it.
